Testing Vallejo Acrylic Metallics

You've got your humungous (1/72nd scale) Revell Razor Crest model in your hot little hands direct from France. The finish is all metal with a few yellow stripes on it.

Your normal go to on metallic finishes is Alclad but Vallejo has recently released a series of acrylic metallic colors and as a plus they are cheaper than Alclad. This is an opportunity to test those colors out and see how they measure up.



The colors I tested are the following. Vallejo

Aluminum 77.701

Magnesium 77.711

Silver 77.724

Gunmetal Grey 77.720

Burnt Iron 77.721


Exhaust Manifold 77.723

Copper 77.710


Gold 77.725

Gloss Black Primer 77.660

The first thing I did with the colors was spray them over the recommended gloss black primer 77.660 to get a feel of how the colors would perform. The following images are of the results.











. I also tried out some Scalemaster acrylic metallic colors. These were recommended for hand brushing by Bob Bethea. Thrash Metal SC-64, Black Metal SC-63 and Elven Gold SC-74




I was happy with the results I got and decided to move forward with testing them on my Razor Crest.

After priming with gloss black I tried different metallic colors on different panels of the Razor Crest.

The variation in colors brought the surface to life. I used the Aluminum, Chrome, Magnesium and Silver on the panels.









All in all these colors lived up to my expectations. There will always be a place for using Alclad but for about half the price these Vallejo colors are going to be my go to.

The Scalemaster colors were recommended to me by Bob Bethea. I was looking for a brushable acrylic metallic for miniatures. He suggested these because of their concentration of pigment.



I recommend you try the Vallejo colors and the Scalemaster ones.
The main advantage is that these colors are acrylic and clean up is with water.

Build and Bull North: A recon report

I attended the North Austin Build-n-Bull at Dragon's Lair and would like to express a few thoughts about the venue. We had four modelers present, and all had ample space to work.


I was pleasantly surprised to discover that the store was spacious, well-lit, and uncrowded even with a significant number of gamers present.

The tables provided for our use are gaming tables, approximately four feet by eight feet in size, workbench height, and well separated from similar tables. One rule, roll up and stow the gaming matt under the table before setting up so we don't get paint and glue on it. However, I caution everyone to show up carrying everything you are going to need. This venue is NOT a full-service hobby shop. If you don't bring glue, don't expect to buy it there. I also did not see any electrical power outlets at the tables, so power tools are probably not going to be usable.

In the past, it has been our practice to break for lunch. The good news is, there is a Hop Daddy's hamburger place not 50 yards away.

The bad news is, I wouldn't suggest leaving your stuff unattended - there is just too much traffic through the store, including kids whose curiosity could create problems with tools, etc. left lying about. We solved it by having someone stay and keep an eye on things when others needed to get something to eat.

All things considered, I enjoyed the day at Dragon's Lair and encourage anyone who can make the next B-and-B to do so. Hauler: M1A1 Abrams with Mine Plow (Dragon kit) Scale: 1/72 by Ben Morton



Hauler continues their excellent detail sets for various small scale model kits. Such is the case with this photo etched set for Revell's M1A1 with mine plow (kit# 7213). While this is PE set is for an older kit (released in 2009) from Revell, this exterior detail set provides just the just the right amount of exterior detail to enhance that kit. Included with this photo etched set are:

- turret stowage bins
- air intake grills
- turret bustle
- ammo boxes
- exhaust grills
- detail bits for all vision blocks
- smoke grenade stowage boxes
- drive sprocket flanges
- friend or foe panels

You really do need to credit Hauler with including parts that you wouldn't otherwise think needed to be replaced with photo etched ones, notably the railings on the stowage boxes either side of the turret. But having said that I am glad that they did. (You know, for the more OCD challenged among us.)

The only quibble I have with this photo etched set is with the title: 'M1A1 Abrams with mine plow'. At first glance it seems to be a detail set for the mine plow and not, as it is, an exterior, detail set for Dragon's M1A1 with mine plow.

This set of exterior details for the Dragon kit of the M1A1 Abrams with mine plow will go along way toward adding the perfect amount of detail for that lingering project. While this set of parts is designed specifically for the Dragon kit many could find a home with Fly Hawk's Abrams series of kits as well.

Eduard is re-releasing their Bf 109G-14/AS in a Profipack edition with five markings selections.


Eduard is also re-releasing their Tornado IDS in a Limited Edition kit with new Marinefleiger decals.






HobbyBoss is releasing a new-tool Hurricane Mk.I.

Kinetic is releasing a new-tool F-16A MLU NATO Viper. The Mid-Life Upgrade (MLU) program brought the existing F-16A fleet up to F-16C standards with cockpit upgrades and the addition of radar-guided missile capabilities.



Meng is releasing a new-tool F-4G Phantom II "Wild Weasel", the variant specialized for defense suppression missions.



Revell is releasing a new-tool Bf 109G-6.

Tamiya has announced a new-tool F-35A Lightning II. While it includes canopy masks, I found no mention of masks for the Radar Absorbent Material (RAM) which furnish the biggest painting challenge of this aircraft.







Hobby Boss who is releasing a German Panther G late with steel wheels.




Academy is releasing a Pzkpw 3 L. This version is supposed to be from the battle of Kursk.






