

Bitte...Take my dog. by Rick Herrington


. If you're not familiar with Operation Paper Clip, it was an Allied (Read American and British) effort to gain German scientific personnel and technology before the Russians did.


The hobby business is tough, just ask Rudy or Marc or Bob King.



Old Rumors and New Kits

New and In View Aircraft by Ron McCracken

October is looking like a good month for new-tool releases. Arma, Zoukei-Mura, ICM, and Italeri have all announced newtool kits, including kits of the Hs 129, F-35B, P-51B, P-39Q, Bf 109Z, and a Ki-21. In addition there are various new-parts re-releases that offer different variants of older kits.

1/32nd Scale:

ICM is re-releasing its Yak-9T as a "Normandy-Neman" edition with figure of ace Marcel Lefevre included.




Zoukei-Mura is releasing a new Hs 129B-3 ground attack aircraft. Lots of detail including full engines and cockpit detail.



1/48th Scale:

AvantGarde Model Kits (AMK) is rereleasing their F-14D Super Tomcat with new parts/decals including a bunch of 3-D printed



Eduard is re-releasing their A6M3 Zero Type 32 in a Profipack edition, with five markings options, color photo-etch parts and painting masks.

A6M3 Zero Type 32

Eduard is releasing an F4F-3/4 Midway Dual Combo kit, with one kit of an F4F-3, and a second complete kit of an F4F-4. Five markings options are provided with each, plus painting masks.



Eduard is re-releasing their Fw 190A-8 in a Weekend Edition. Remember, these boxings don't include things like masks, photo-etch, etc. It does include four markings options.



Eduard is re-releasing their Z-326 Trener in a Master Dual Combo kit, with color photo-etch and 10 markings options.



Great Wall is re-releasing their 2012-vintage MiG-29 Fulcrum C in 'Ghost of Kyiv' markings.



HobbyBoss is re-releasing their old F4U-4 kit as an F4U-1D Corsair, obviously with some new parts due to the differences in the



Italeri is releasing a new-tool F-35B Lightning II with five markings options, two for USMC, one for the Italian Navy, and two



Modelsvit has released a new kit of the Bf 109Z Zwilling (twin), an aircraft similar in concept to the USAF F-82 Twin Mustang.



Revell is re-releasing their B-24D Liberator. I was unable to find any details about what, if anything, changed since the last



Zoukei-Mura is releasing an F-4G Phantom II, a new-parts evolution of their earlier F-4E. The "G" model is optimized for the "Wild Weasel", or SAM suppression, role.





1/72nd Scale:

Arma has released a new-tool kit of the P-39Q Airacobra. A review in Hyperscale ndicates the kit includes parts allowing a model of all versions from the D through the Q variants, including the P-400 used on Guadalcanal.



Arma has also released a new-tool P-51B Mustang. It can be built as either a B or C, and comes with four decal options and pre-cut painting masks.



Big Plane Kits is releasing a P-8A Poseidon ASW version of their earlier Boeing 737-800, with additional parts and new decals.



Big Plane Kits is re-releasing their 737-200 in Olympic Airlines markings. For military fans, this version was the basis for the T-43 navigation trainer, should you be up for a conversion effort.



Great Wall Hobby is re-releasing a new-parts version of its F-14B Tomcat in VF-101 (Grim Reapers) markings.



Great Wall is also releasing a new-parts variant of their F-15E w/New Targeting Pod and GBU-39 Small Diameter Bomb payload.



Hasegawa is re-releasing its F-15DJ Eagle in 'Aggressor Minokasago' markings. A very colorful aircraft for those who want something altogether different in an F-15 model.



Hasegawa has announced a re-release of their P1Y2 Ginga (Frances) Type 11 Night Fighter. So far as I can determine, nothing new other than the decals from earlier releases.



Hasegawa is re-releasing their UH-60J(SP) Rescue Hawk in "Naha Air Rescue 40th



ICM has announced a new-tool Ki-21-Ib Sally heavy bomber with four decal options.





Italeri is re-releasing their 1989-vintage V-22 Osprey with new decals.



1/144th Scale: DML has announced an F/A-18E Super Hornet in VFA-87 markings.



1/200th Scale:

Hasegawa is re-releasing their Boeing 747 kit in VC-25A Air Force One markings.



So, there you have it for October. Happy shopping (and modeling).

Starting off with 1/700 scale Vee Hobby is up first with a release of the USS SanDiego CL-53. San Diego was an Atlanta Class Anti-Aircraft cruiser.





Pit Road is releasing the French battleship Jean Bart.




Trumpeter has a couple of welcome releases for us in the form of HMS Kent and HMS Cornwall. Both are County Class heavy cruisers.





1/600 scale is up next. Airfix is re-releasing their kit of HMS Devonshire.



Moving on to **1/350th** scale first up is Bunker Studio, known for their super detai parts, with an IJN Super Yamato 20 inch twin gun turret kit.

It looks like this kit is 3D molded but whatever their process it's pretty pricey at \$89.95. You'll need three of these to complete your Yamato.



Magic factory is releasing a People's Liberation Army/Navy Typr 55 destroyer.



Trumpeter is releasing a DKM World of Warships "What IF" battleship the DKM Barbarossa. This battlescruiser was planned originally to be built as part of Plan Z but never made it through the planning stages.



An unusual release from ICM in 1/350th scale is the Kreigsfischkutter multi purpose boat.



Last in 1/350 scale is a release of the IJN Hmamkaze by Hasegawa.



Last in this month's column is a 1/144th scale type IX U-boat from Revell.



That's all the wind in the sails for this month. Grab a kit from that stash and build it!

Some great releases to get to this month. Let's start off with 1/72nd scale. First up is Fore Hobby with a British Scimitar.







Next from Meng we have a modern Chinese PLA ZTQ 15 Light tank.

Vespid Models is releasing a Panther F.



Moving on to 1/35th scale let me pause to speak from my Bully Pulpit. I know we live in inflationary times but as modelers have you noticed how the price of kits has jumped,

especially those kits that reflect vehicled involed in the Ukrainian conflict? It has definately kept me from buying a T-72.

First up is Takom with two new "What If" releases. First up is a VK 100.01 Mammut.

Second is a VK 168.01 Super Heavy tank. Although this was actually designed by Porsche it never made it past the blue print stage.



Pit Road is up next with its release of a IGSDF wheeled command car.





Two new Israeli releases from the folks at AFV. First from them is an M113A1 Nagmash (1975)



Next is an M38A1 CJ-5 Orev.



Das Werk has three new ones for us this month. Let's start off with their World of Tanks "What If" release, a Schwerer Kleiner Pzkpfw..





Next from Das Werk is a Sdkfz 250 Ausf B. This looks like a great little release of a half-track that was used on almost every front.



Last from Das Werk is their release of a T-72M. This release is in association with Amusing Hobby. Das Werk is known for taking more expensive kits and releasing them without the full interiors to make them more affordable. This is a timely release.



Sticking to the topic of T-72's Meng has a new release of a T-72B3M. The kit comes complete with a KMT-8 mine clearing system. This is also one of the first kits to include the bag like reactive armor the Russians have introduced.








Dragon is up next with a German Sdkfz 10 complete with infantry figures.



ICM has two new releases for us this month. The first is a Chevrolet G7107 truck with a wooden body.







