

Judging Gundam Models

Working with Water by Rick Herrington

At last month's meeting I gave a quick presentation on modelling water with scale models. Ron McCracken has a project he wants to tackle showing an Allied river crossing so he was interested in learnig how to do it. The 15 minute breif overview was just not enough so I promised a more in depth explanation in this month's newsletter.

I'm one of the few ship builders in the club and always like to portray a ship in its natural element, the sea. I've got to admit it's been a journey getting comfortable with portraying the liquid stuff and being satisfied with the outcome.

I'm not going to spend to much time on replicating ocean water in this article but I will direct you to some Youtube videos that explain it step by step and after having tried the method I use it for my ship bases. Guido Hopp is the presenter and he's building a Trumpeter 1/350 scale Admiral Gaf Spee. In part 2 and part 3 (reloaded) he goes into re-creating his process for a seascape in detail. I've tried it several times and have added some tweaks of my own but I highly recommend it.

This month's article is something less ambitious. I'm going to replicate a small stream which could be used with a vehicle or figures. I use styrofoam insulation for my bases. It's available from Lowe's and Home Depot. I received a couple of years worth free from a friend.

The first step is to carve out a channel in the styrofoam for your future stream.



I used Liquitex Natural Sand to coat the styrofoam to produce a soil like texture.





Next I added a layer of sand to the surface after coating the base with Sobo glue although any white glue would work. I also added some rocks to the base to give the water something to flow around.



Now it's time for the water. I use Liquitex Acrylic Gel Medium. This is great stuff. You can pick this up at Michael's or Hobby Lobby or your local art supply store.



The gel is white and dries clear.











This stream is about 1/4 inch deep. To produce a deeper stream or river I suggest you work in layers, letting each layer dry until its completely clear. That's all there is to it I hope this helps.

The convention planning team will also order the required welcome sign with the convention logo and have it

delivered to the appropriate ASMS member before the kick-off of the convention. Further coordination of details will be accomplished once the team of volunteers are identified.






Joaquin R. also shared his IJN Shokaku in 1/700 scale. Charlie showed him his building tehniques as they both built these kits together.

1/32nd Scale:

HK Model has announced a new-tool A-20G Havoc in European theater markings.



Italeri has announced a new-tool MC.202 Folgore for release sometime in the second Quarter of the year, which should mean any time now!



Trumpeter has announced an F-35B Lightning II based on their earlier F-35C kit, which completes the series.





Shipping News by Rick Herrington


Ahoy mates. Slim pickens for both 1/700 and 1/350 scale. Maybe the manufacturers are taking a summer holiday. Let's ge started with what little we have in 1/700 with Modelium. they are releasing a couple of JMSDF naval support vessels a YF2121 traffic ship and a YT01 Tugboat type D.



Pit Road has several new releases for us. The first is an IJN destroyer the Kagero. The kit portrays her as she looked at the time of her comissioning and includes extensive photo etch with the kit.









Pit Road is also releasing the IJN tanker Ashizuri.

Finally from Pit Road is the JMSDF support ship Towada AOE 422



Sea Way is releasing the IJN light cruiser Noshiro. it looks like this is a re-boxing of a Fujimi release.



Last up in 1/700 scale is a newcomer company (2021) Vee Hobby. From their product list they're concentrating exclusively on USN WW2 battleships. They have two upcoming releases, the Indiana and the South Dakota.





Moving on to 1/350th scale first up is Hobby Boss with the US battleship Iowa.



AB&K is next with their release of an IJN destroyer Mutsuki. This kit is unusual as it is all 3d printed.



Last in 1/350 is Trumpeter's DKM H class German battleship (new variant). This kit represents the H-41 class which had 16.5 inch guns and reinforced armor over the original H class vessels.

This was a planned vessel only and never was built.






