

Kotare 1/32 Spitfire Mk.1a "Brian Lane" Building experience: Dave Edgerly



First off, I am a lover of the early Supermarine Spitfires. That began at a very young age. My father gave me a carved wooden Spit that he built during WWII. All young boys at that time were encouraged to carve aircraft models for ID purposes. He did several German, Japanese, American and British. I just thought that the Spitfire was the most beautiful airplane. I was hooked and wish that I still had it. It was in my grandparents' house when it was sold while I was stationed overseas. Sigh.

On to impressions of this kit There are many reviews and opinions on the Kotare offerings. All have valid opinions. Some I disagree and some I agree with.

There was one build review that I didn't agree with at all. The reviewer was building a commission and hadn't done any research on the company and its engineering philosophy. Those who don't know that this team is the same as the Wing Nut Wings will be in for a bit of a surprise. He had quite an issue with fit not realizing that the tolerances were very tight and paint on the mating surfaces cause difficulties. So, if you've never built a WNW Great War subject, be advised that mating surfaces MUST be clear of paint.


OK. Enough ramblings.

This kit is of the early Mk. 1a and includes a lovely figure of Squadron Leader Brian Lane and a set of resin exhausts,

First up in the cockpit. Wow! IMHO it blows the socks off the Tamiya Mk IX series. Most of the parts in the kit are for the cockpit. I had a few minor issues only. Didn't like the molded Sutton harness option and some of the tiny decals for the instrument panel being white were beyond my lousy vision. (Even with the Optivisor) Using an aftermarket set is not necessary in the least.







I opted for the HGW fabric set. Got the wrong one first and it's sitting in the spares box. The correct one was beautiful if remarkably tedious. I recommend leaving the PE parts attached to their fret and looping the fabric through. They sure look good when done.


Follow the steps in order and it works. Deviation can lead to issues. Hmm, how do I know this? I broke the push-pull rods for the rudder control by figuring I could install when I wanted to do so.

Side walls and bulkheads all snug right into place The fuselage assembly is easy and the fit is, again, superb.

I do agree that the rivet detail on the fuselage is a bit too prominent but a little sanding of them scales them better to me

The wings need a bit of modification to meet the Mk. 1a early configuration. The instructions are clear on this. I did a lot of test fitting the wheel wells and landing gear before gluing the wing uppers and lower together.

The instructions show where to trim the LG legs so that they'll fit into their slots. They mean it. The end result is perfect LG alignment



Make sure that you attach the wing fillets as instructed or you'll fight with the wing attachment. The build reviewer who I watched did not follow the steps and had to disassemble his. No disassembly.

The only place I used any filler was where the wing met the underbelly. Vallejo Plastic Putty did the job. Assembly is pretty much done.

So now it's time for painting the airframe. This particular aircraft was pretty new so not much weathering was planned. The real thing flew Dunkirk and Battle of Britain missions and photos of her in the instruction show a fairly clean plane, The underbelly was field applied mix of either Sky Type S of light blue. This was over the Half Black/Half White scheme. There were no stencils evident here. The wheel wells and inner portion of the gear doors were still in their respective black or white.

I paint a little Alclad II aluminum on the trailing edge of the port wing. After a coat of grey primer, of course. Did some grimy black pre-shading and applied my idea of the blue belly. It kinda came out more robin egg blue but I like it and it sits on my shelf. The Dark Earth and Dark Green are Model Air items that appear sort of dark to me but apparently, there was al fair number of variations to these 2 colors in practice. I attacked the trailing edge it a tooth pick to reveal the bare aluminum chipping.




Clear coat, decals and semi matte sealer.

Final assembly added clear parts, prop, pitot tub, antenna and wire.

The last item was my feeble attempt at the figure. Apologies to all figure painters.

It is a very good kit. I'd say it's the best early Spit in any scale on the market and I went and ordered them all.

Although the show was a bit light on one of our staples - aircraft- the car models helped fill the gaps in.











There were 405 total model entries and as I mentioned before the quality of the work was superb.

















Gunpla was well represented this year with 31 entries.











Jackson Hunter shared several projects with the group.










Pete Dasso shared his first ship kit build with the group. Pete did an excellent job of building Tamiya's IJN Kagero.

Trumpeter is re-releasing their TBD-1 as TBD-1A Devastator. This is the floatplane variant, with new parts for the floats.






Zoukei-Mura is releasing a new-tool Fw 190A-4.

Ahoy mates! Lots to get to this month so let's get to it with 1/700 scale. First up is Trumpeter with a new-tool USN Missouri.




Trumpeter also has a British cruiser HMS Colombo.

Next from Pit Road is the Japanese destroyer Fuyuzuki.






Last from Pit Road is the modern JMSDF Mogami

CMK is releasing a 40 mm Bofors. I believe these are meant for Italeri's PT Boat kits.




Zimi Models has a 1/35th scale Quad 40mm anti aircraft gun..



I Love Kits is releasing a C-Ram Phalanx.




DML is re-releasing their Panther D in a Kursk anniversay edition.





Membership also qualifies you to participate in IPMS/USA sanctioned contests, and particularly in our


