
A Zeppelin for Pioneer Flight Museum


Ammo Terraform Premium Textures: Road Sand

"Communication Chief Lizbeth informed me that we were receiving an automated distress signal from a terra forming station on the planetoid LV-426. While not exactly on our current flight path we were the closet ship available to investigate..."

AMMO by Mig Jimenez offers a plethora of finishing and diorama accessories for just about any modeling need: paints, static grass, scenic plants and pliable terrain, among others. One such item is from their Terra Form Premium Textures line of acrylic base ground textures. Case in point is item 2178: Road Sand.

For those that are not that familiar, AMMO's line of products have previously produced a series of ground textures (mud, concrete, etc.) that trend toward a somewhat coarse texture. The products in the Premium Textures line are similar to those but with, what appears to be, a finer grain. When applied these products make for a much smoother and, for me, more realistic surface.





All of these textures are acrylic based so they can be thinned with water. Which is especially helpful when it comes to tidying up as you can also do so with H₂O. Another feature of the acrylic base is that these textures can be combined with acrylic paints to fashion custom colors, patterns or staining.



Old Rumors and New Kits

New and In View Aircraft by Ron McCracken

September is a great month for Hawker Hurricane fans – no less than three new or revised kits. There is also a new-tool AJ-1 Savage kit coming out for U.S. Navy enthusiasts, and a Ka-29 kit for the helicopter fans. Otherwise, it is mostly a selection of re-releases with new decals. But still, not a bad month over all.

1/32nd Scale:

Fly is re-releasing its Hurricane Mk.IIc/Mk.IIc Tropical in a night fighter color scheme. This kit came out as a new-tool in 2016, and gets re-packaged about twice a year.



Fly has also released a Hurricane Mk.IIa/Trop based on the Mk.IIc with alternate parts.



Revell has announced a new-tool Hurricane Mk.IIb. At present it appears to be only available as a pre-order.



1/35th Scale:

Trumpeter has released a new-tool Ka-29 Helix B.



1/48th Scale:

Eduard is re-releasing its Fw 190A-3 Light Fighter in a Profipack edition, with five markings options, color photo-etch parts, and painting masks.



Eduard is also releasing their Tempest Mk.II as a Limited edition "Ultimate Tempest" kit.



Hasegawa is re-releasing its F-16D Fighting Falcon in 'Korean AF' markings. New decals appear to be the only change.





Hasegawa is re-releasing their J7W1 Interceptor Fighter Shinden with new decals.



Hasegawa is re-releasing their T-4 kit in 'Blue Impulse 2022' markings.



ICM is re-releasing their Beaufort Mk.IA/Trop with new parts including tropical filters.

Meng is re-releasing their F/A-18F Super Hornet in VFA-2 Bounty Hunters markings.



1/72nd Scale:

Eduard is re-releasing Bf 110E in a Weekend edition. It comes with four markings options, but no extras like photo-etch or masks.



Eduard is re-releasing their S-199 with the Erel Canopy, in Israeli markings.





Fine Molds is re-releasing their F-14A Tomcat in IRIAF (Iranian Air Force) markings.



Revell is re-releasing their A400M Atlas in new RAF markings.



Hasegawa is re-releasing their F-35B Lightning II in markings of the Prototype, which adds a bit of color to what is otherwise a rather drab paint scheme.



Roden is releasing an AJ-1 Savage with a Nuclear Bomb. This should make a nice change from the aging Mach 2 kit.



HobbyBoss is re-releasing their U-2C Dragon Lady in Taiwanese markings.



1/200th Scale:

Hasegawa is re-releasing their KC-130H Hercules in a 'JASDF Gray Scheme' with new decals.

I Love Kit is also releasing a USS Enterprise.






Fujimi is releasing the IJN Battleship Fuso.




Moving on to 1/72nd scale Takom is releasing the Bismarck's secondary armament 15cm turret.

Second from Trumpeter is an RS121 M1 rocket system.






